

Flower City AmeriCorps Member Service

- Flower City AmeriCorps members collectively served 31,018 hours, with over 40% of members exceeding their service hour goal. Members also earned a total of \$83,737 in education awards.


Education

- Eight Flower City AmeriCorps members delivered early childhood development services and Raising a Reader programming to 324 youth, surpassing our goal of 200 youth served.

Economic Opportunity

- Four Flower City AmeriCorps members delivered financial literacy services to 640 individuals, surpassing our goal of 80 individuals served.
- Four Flower City AmeriCorps delivered employment readiness and job placement services to 365 individuals, surpassing our goal of 225 individuals served.
- Two Flower City AmeriCorps members recruited 14 new adult mentors to participate in the Mentors Matter program.


Members by Race/Ethnicity



Healthy Futures

- One Flower City AmeriCorps member successfully reinstated the Positive Tickets program with the Rochester Police Department (RPD) and assisted in creating and implementing official procedure for documenting Positive Tickets in the RPD database.
- Two Flower City AmeriCorps members delivered positive youth development and pregnancy prevention curricula to 362 youth, surpassing our goal of 80 youth served.
- One Flower City AmeriCorps member assisted the Public Market in selling \$698,143 in SNAP tokens through 22,839 transactions.

Members by Age




Quadrant-Based Programming

Four Flower City AmeriCorps members served as team leaders in four of the city's most distinguished community service agencies, one in each quadrant. In addition to everyday support to the quadrants, quadrant-based teams participated in special events and projects.

- One group of members collected school supplies from community members and distributed close to 150 backpacks filled with supplies to school-aged youth during a back-to-school rally.
- Another group of members hosted a Valentine's Day luncheon for elders.
