

#### **About the Project**

The Thurston Village Revitalization Project includes the design and construction of right of way improvements on Thurston Road between Ravenwood Avenue and Brooks Avenue. These improvements will enhance the urban village feel of the corridor. The City will explore opportunities for improvements in aesthetics, lighting, safety, street furniture, street trees, walkability, traffic, signage and gateway features as part of this project.

### **Project Limits**

Brooks Avenue to Ravenwood Avenue (0.5 Miles)

## **Potential Features for Project**

- 1. Street Improvements
  - a. Curb Bump-outs
  - b. High Visibility Crosswalks
  - c. Traffic Signal Upgrades
  - d. Signage & Striping
  - e. Sidewalk replacements
  - f. Lighting improvements
- 2. Streetscape Components
  - a. Identity features (gateways)
  - b. Landscape improvements
  - c. Street furnishings

### **Tentative Schedule & Costs**

Start Construction: Spring 2014
End Construction: Fall 2014

- Project construction cost is approximately \$1.8 Million
- The project will be funded 100% by the City of Rochester
