



### **Proposed Improvements**

- New Asphalt Pavement
- New Granite Curbs
- New Concrete Sidewalks
- New Cycle Track for Bicyclists
- New Street Trees
- New Bicycle Racks and Benches
- Green infrastructure Improvements
- New Street Lighting
- New Traffic Signals
- New Traffic Signs and Striping
- Sewer Improvements
- Water Main Improvements

## **Expected Construction Impacts**

#### **Traffic Patterns**

- 1. Permanent Closure of the Inner Loop
- 2. Posted Detours for Bridge Closures
- 3. Typical Construction Delays within Project Limits

#### **Access**

- 1. Streets will remain open with lane reductions.
- 2. Parking will be maintained, although spot locations may require temporary restrictions for construction activities.
- 3. Sidewalks will be maintained along at least one side of the roadway.
- 4. Driveway access will remain, however curb and sidewalk replacements at these locations will require temporary closure to perform work.
- 5. Short term shutdown of water services to perform connections to new mains.
- 6. Temporary business signs for impacted businesses


Notifications will be given prior to all changes in access



#### <u>Phase 1A – Fill In The Inner Loop</u>

- 1. Close the inner Loop (*Tentative Date Mid-November*)
- 2. Maintain Union Street Northbound traffic and Parking Lane along West Side of Union Street.
- 3. Maintain Pitkin Street Southbound traffic
- 4. Remove the Broad Street Bridge (Tentatively Winter 2014)
- 5. Place Fill
- 6. Construct West Side of Union Street
- 7. Construct Savannah, Broad, and Charlotte Street Connections
- 8. Remove East Avenue Bridge (Tentatively Summer 2015)
- 9. Complete West Side of Union Street








#### Phase 1B – East Side Of Union Street

- 1. Move Northbound Traffic onto new pavement (West Side) and maintain parking along west side of union Street.
- 2. Maintain Pitkin Street Southbound traffic
- 3. Construct the East Side of union Street










#### Phase 2 – Build / Abandon Pitkin Street

- 1. Convert Union Street to Two-Way Traffic (Northbound and Southbound)
- 2. Close Pitkin Street
- 3. Remove Portion of Pitkin to be Abandoned (South of East Avenue)
- 4. Reconstruct Portion of Pitkin to remain (North of East Avenue)










#### Phase 3 – Monroe / Chestnut Area

- 1. Remove the Monroe Avenue Bridge (TBD 2016)
- 2. Maintain on and off ramps to I-490
- 3. Detour Northbound / Southbound traffic to Union Street
- 4. Stage Construct Monroe and Chestnut
