



MARKET RENOVATION/ADDITION PROJECT UPDATE

Great news! Bids were re-opened January 5 for the City of Rochester Public Market's \$8 million renovation and addition project, and this time the bids were much more competitive and within budget. The City's purchasing department has started the award process, which can take up to three months. Right now the City anticipates a ground-breaking and project start in April.

The project from start to finish should take 16-18 months. The first phase will involve infrastructure and utility work along the concrete median adjacent to the "Commission Row" buildings. This will be followed by construction of the new outdoor, covered "D" Shed--to be built in the same area where an original 1904 outdoor covered shed was demolished in 1963--and the fabrication of new structures for the food stands. When the "D" Shed is complete, the "B" Shed (indoor, "winter" shed) vendors will be temporarily relocated into the new "D" Shed, which will be temporarily enclosed for them; and food stands will move into their new homes that will be temporarily located in the parking lot at the west end of the Market.

These temporary relocations will allow demolition of the existing and construction of the new indoor "B" Shed, which should take 10-12 months. When completed, indoor shed vendors and food stands will be moved back to their permanent locations, and the temporary enclosure of the new outdoor "D" Shed removed.

Concurrent to construction, the Public Market will be soliciting applications for approximately 50 new vending spaces in the new outdoor, covered "D" shed, and for any open locations in the new indoor "B" Shed.

During February-March 2016 the City will be scheduling individual meetings with all the indoor and food stand vendors to discuss placement and space preferences in the new structures, to discuss any special needs, and to clarify dates and logistics related to the temporary operations. issue updates at least bi-weekly. There will be some disruption during the construction but our goal is to minimize any impact on Market operations. We will utilize signage on site, social media and City website, and the *Market Matters* newsletter to keep vendors, Market tenants and customers informed. We will also update all vendors at our spring vendor meeting in April.

This is an exciting time for the Market, as we provide the facilities and amenities needed to support the diverse needs and desires of our vendors and customers, and also meet all current codes and regulations.



The City of Rochester Public Market has served the community on its Union Street site since 1905. In 1905...there were only 45 stars on the flag
(OK, NM, AZ, HI, and AK had yet to join the union)
...Theodore Roosevelt was President (Franklin Roosevelt was only 23)
...Wilbur Wright managed to keep his airplane aloft for 39 minutes
...there were 6.5 million farms in the U.S. (2 million today)
...the average life expectancy for Americans was 47
...There were about 8,000 cars in the U.S.
...the average wage in the U.S. was 22 cents per hour
...95% of babies were born at home
...6% of adult Americans were high school graduates

Although there will surely be many major changes in the next 111 years, we do expect that in in 2117, the Public Market will still be on Union Street, and going strong.
