

(Data current through 8/5/2018; homicide numbers and shooting graph current as of 8/7/2018)



The crimes presented here are FBI Part I Crimes under the Uniform Crime Reporting program. The weekly report date is on Wednesday but the numbers reported for the week are complete through the previous Sunday. This allows for more accurate information due to reporting delays.



#### Shooting Victims

RPD also tracks the number of shooting victims. Such data are normally within the crime type of aggravated assault above, but nonshooting assaults are also included there. The red line is the current year (note that data for the current month are displayed even when the month is not complete). 10 year minimum, maximum, and average lines are also presented for historical comparison.

#### **Sub-Committees:**

#### Education Committee

The Education Committee will identify existing programs within the City of Rochester (i.e. R-Centers) to assist with efforts of informing individuals and groups about topics pertaining to the effects of gun violence in communities. The ED-C will also use data to create new curriculum or programming that will align with the mission of RAGVC.

# Advocacy Committee

The Advocacy Committee will create new legislation that is supportive of RAGVC mission in addition to coordinating efforts to support existing laws that attribute to eliminating gun violence.

# Eradication Committee The Eradication Committee will identify agencies who address gun violence through their work, recruit volunteers, and mobilize the RAGVC's awareness,

prevention and assistance teams.

### Media committee

The Media Committee is responsible for managing all RAGVC's social media platforms, organizing press events, overseeing public messaging, and creating a calendar of events with ongoing updates.

# RAGVC BY-LAWS

#### **MISSION**

#### **PURPOSE**

The ROC Against Gun
Violence Coalition will
educate youth and the
community at large of the
dangers and collateral effects
of gun violence, encourage
individuals to engage in
diversion programs that lead
to positive outcomes for their
families and neighborhoods.

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

#### ELIGIBILITY OF MEMBERS AND PARTNERS

Organizations, groups, or individuals may become members or partners with approval from the RAGVC Chairperson. The Chair reserves the right to discontinue the membership of any person or group with explanation sent in written form the member.

#### RIGHTS OF MEMBERS AND PARTNERS

Members may participate in RAGVC meetings and activities. Members may choose to discontinue their membership at any time and shall inform the RAGVC Chairperson of their departure in writing.

#### MEETING OF MEMBERS

#### REGULAR MEETINGS

Meetings will take place every 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month.

#### SPECIAL MEETINGS

Any special meetings will be called by RAGVC Chair or Vice Chair.

#### NOTICE OF MEETINGS

Meeting notices will be given by the Legislative Assistant of the RAGVC Chair in coordination with the RAGVC Secretary.

#### **OFFICERS**

#### **CHAIR**

The Chair serves as the spokesperson for RAGVC. The Chair approves all recommendations and oversees all work done in the name of the RAGVC.

#### VICF-CHAIR

The Vice-chair is a direct support to the chair. The VC will have the authority to perform all duties of the Chair in the absence of the Chairperson (another person will be designated by the Chair in the absence of the VC).

#### **SECRETARY**

The Secretary will serve as the records keeper of RAGVC by take meeting minute notes at each coalition meeting. The Secretary, in conjunction with RAGVC's chair's legislative aide, will be responsible to keep all notes and documents of RAGVC on file (electronic and hard copy).

#### **TREASURER**

The Treasurer will keep records of all expenditures, funds raised for RAGVC, and facilitate fundraising opportunities.

#### **COMMITTEES**

#### **COMMITTEE FORMATION**

The RAGVC Chair may create or retract committees as needed.

#### **SELECTION OF COMMITTEE CHAIRS**

The Chairperson will make the appointment of all sub-committee chair positions.

#### COMMITTEE CHAIR TERM LIMITS

Each Committee Chair will serve two year terms.

#### **BOOKS & RECORDS**

RAGVC Chair's legislative aide, in conjunction with the RAGVC Secretary, shall keep complete books and records of account and minutes of RAGVC proceedings.

#### ADOPTION OF BYLAWS

We, the undersigned, are the Chair and Vice-Chair of this Coalition, and we consent to, and hereby do, adopt the foregoing Bylaws, consisting of the two preceding pages, as the Bylaws of this Coalition. We reserve the right to amend this document as needed with discussion to affected parties.
