







The goal of the Mayor's Neighborhood Leadership Training program is to build the capacity of civically- minded community members to be skillful and effective leaders. This program has been community-driven from the start, and has been developed in cooperation with community residents and City staff. This program is part of the implementation of Rochester 2034, which has a goal to build the capacity of community organizations and associations.

The Mayor's Neighborhood Leadership Training program will give participants the opportunity to refine existing skills and learn new ones. Topic areas will include Tools and Techniques for Neighborhood Leadership, Learning about City Hall, Creating Opportunity in My Neighborhood, Effective Neighborhood Outreach, Housing in my Neighborhood, and Reaching our Neighborhood Young People.

We realize that your time is valuable, and therefore we have put together what we believe to be a program that will fit into busy schedules. The program will consist of 16 hours split into eight sessions, including a kick off and wrap up session and six training sessions, from September 30 to November 18, 2021. We encourage anyone interested in making a difference in their community to apply, whether or not you are currently affiliated with a neighborhood association. This program will be offered twice a year, so if you are not selected for the fall semester, we will hold your application for the option of joining us for the spring semester.
