

# About Our Program

The Do The Right Thing Award Program has been part of the Rochester Police Department since 1995. The goal of the program is to foster positive relationships between local area law enforcement and the youth within Monroe County. The Do The Right Thing Award Program recognizes children for their positive behavior, accomplishments, and good deeds by rewarding students who strive to make good choices, do well in school, give back to their communities, or demonstrate "turn-around" or improved behavior.



Any student enrolled in grades K - 12 in any school within Monroe County is eligible for nomination, and can be nominated for acts of courage and bravery, such as assisting first responders, as well as acts of volunteerism, leadership and role model behavior. Students may be nominated for incidents that have occurred within one year of the nomination, and within Monroe County.

Anyone over 18 years old can nominate a student (this includes first responders, teachers, coaches, family, and friends). Nominations are accepted throughout the year, and are reviewed by a committee that selects students to receive the Do The Right Thing Award. Selected students are celebrated at a ceremony at the City Public Safety Building. Ceremonies are held during the school year, with approximately ten students recognized at each ceremony. Usually family and friends are welcome to attend these ceremonies, however there may be times when ceremonies may be held virtually due to safety concerns. If this is the case, attendance would be watching via Facebook Live on our Facebook page. A decision whether a ceremony will be held in-person or virtually will be made as each award ceremony date gets closer, and will be announced on our website and social media pages. Regardless, all ceremonies, whether in-person or virtual, will be recorded and shared on Facebook, so you'll never have to worry about missing a ceremony, and you can always go back and watch past recorded ceremonies as many times as you'd like!

Do The Right Thing Award winners are eligible to receive several rewards and prizes donated by program sponsors, and winners may also apply for a college or trade school scholarship when they are high school seniors. Since the program began, we have received over 4,000 nominations, awarded over 1,100 winners, and contributed over \$100,000 towards scholarships for our winners. Students selected as winners must attend an award ceremony in order to officially be considered a Do The Right Thing Winner, unless the ceremony is held to be considered as winners are nominated will receive a letter of recognition for their act, even if they are not to chosen as a winner.

Each ceremony and the winners are highlighted in the media, courtesy of program sponsor News 10NBC WHEC-TV. Stories are televised on WHEC and highlighted on-line as well. Visit their website at <u>WHEC.com</u> to view past highlights.

# Presentation of 2022 Scholarship Winners

Congratulations to our 2022 Do The Right Thing scholarship winners, **Jahleeya Roberts** and **Caleb Shepard**! Both winners graduated from Rochester City School District's World of Inquiry School #58, and attended our Family Fun Celebration Day at Seabreeze, where we recognized their accomplishments and presented each of them with a \$1,000 'check' which will be used towards their college expenses.

Jahleeya will be attending Monroe Community College where she will major in Early Childhood Education. She aspires to be a preschool or kindergarten teacher, or a daycare provider.

Jahleeya was a Do The Right Thing winner in December 2016, when she was a 7<sup>th</sup> grader at World of Inquiry School #58. She was nominated for the courage and compassion she displayed when she helped a fellow student who was in crisis.





Caleb will be attending RIT where he will major in Biomedical Engineering. He also hopes to continue to pursue his passion for music.

Caleb was a Do The Right thing winner in November 2015 when he was in 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Frank Fowler Dow School #52. He was nominated after he performed the Heimlich Maneuver on a fellow classmate that was choking.

Each year, all previous Do The Right Thing Award winners that are currently high school seniors may apply for a scholarship to be applied towards the payment of their college or trade school tuition or expenses. A selection committee reviews all applications, and the number of winners selected each year is determined by the amount of program funding available. Since 1997 our program has award 110 recipients \$110,000 in college and/or trade school scholarships!
