Rochester Community University is designed to help residents learn how to advocate for themselves and their neighborhoods. Participants attend a series of workshops that give them insight into City and local resources that they can use to address issues affecting them and their neighbors.

This community-driven program is developed in cooperation with City staff and residents and is part of the implementation of the Rochester 2034 Comprehensive Plan, which includes the goal of building the capacity of neighborhood and community organizations and associations.

Rochester Community University allows participants to refine existing skills and learn new ones. We encourage anyone interested in making a difference in their community to apply, whether or not you are affiliated with a neighborhood association.

This program takes place twice a year. If a series is full when you apply, we will add you to a waiting list for the next session.
