I hereby certify that the following is a true copy of an ordinance which was duly passed by the Council of the City of Rochester on **August 20, 2024** and **Approved** by the Mayor of the City of Rochester, and was deemed duly adopted on **August 21, 2024** in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

Ordinance No. 2024-242

Authorizing appropriations and agreements relating to Phase 1 Exchange Street Park Improvements of the Vacuum Oil Brownfield Opportunity Area River Trail Improvements Project, as amended

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. The Council hereby appropriates \$500,000 in anticipated reimbursements from the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York (DASNY) to fund Phase 1 Exchange Street Park Improvements of the Vacuum Oil Brownfield Opportunity Area River Trail Improvements Project (Project).

Section 2. The Council hereby authorizes the Mayor to enter into an agreement with Rochester Gas & Electric Corporation (RG&E) for the receipt and use of \$141,833, which amount is hereby appropriated to fund a portion of the design and construction of electrical infrastructure and lighting improvements for the Project.

Section 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services agreement with Arcadis of New York, Inc. to provide resident project representation (RPR) services for the Project. The maximum compensation for the agreement shall be \$134,800, which shall be funded in the amounts of \$131,885.50 from 2018-19 Cash Capital and \$2,914.50 from 2022-23 Cash Capital. The term of the agreement shall continue to three months after the completion of the two-year guarantee inspection of the Project.

Section 4. The agreements authorized herein shall contain such additional terms and conditions as the Mayor deems appropriate.

Section 5. Ordinance No. 2020-111, Authorizing an agreement for the Vacuum Oil Brownfield Opportunity Area River Trail, is hereby amended in Section 1 thereof to read as follows:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services agreement with Bergmann Associates, Architects, Engineers, Landscape Architects & Surveyors, D.P.C. for design services for the Vacuum Oil Brownfield Opportunity Area River Trail. The maximum compensation for the agreement shall be \$100,000, which shall be funded in the amounts of \$20,000 in reimbursements from the Rochester Gas and Electric Corporation's Commercial Corridor/Main Street Revitalization Assistance program appropriated in Ordinance No. 2024- 242 and \$80,000 from 2018-19 Cash Capital. The term of the agreement shall continue until six months after acceptance of the design documents.

Section 6. The Mayor is further authorized to develop an amendment to the 2025-2029 CIP addressing future phases of the Project to continue to effectively realize important components from the PLEX Community Park Master Plan that are not included in this Phase 1 Project.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

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Ordinance No. 2024-243

**Authorizing appropriations and agreements for the Joseph A. Floreano
Rochester Riverside Convention Center (RRCC) Building Envelope Repairs
and Main Street Addition Project**

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. The Council hereby appropriates \$4,325,000 in anticipated reimbursements from ROC the Riverway/Upstate Revitalization Initiative administered by Empire State Development to fund a portion of the costs for the Joseph A. Floreano Rochester Riverside Convention Center (RRCC) Building Envelope Repairs and Main Street Addition Project (Project).

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services agreement with LiRo Engineers, Inc. to provide construction management and resident project representation (RPR) services for the Project. The maximum compensation for the agreement shall be \$1,400,000, which shall be funded from the proceeds of City bonds authorized and appropriated in a concurrent ordinance. The term of the agreement shall continue to three months after the completion of the two-year guarantee inspection of the Project.

Section 3. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an amendatory agreement with Stantec Consulting Services Inc. to provide additional services for the Project. The amendatory agreement shall amend the existing agreement authorized by Ordinance No. 2021-53 and amended in Ordinance Nos. 2023-3 and 2023-68 by adding

construction administration services to the scope of work and by increasing the maximum compensation by \$500,000 to a new total of \$2,950,000. The amendatory compensation shall be funded in the amounts of \$400,000 from the ROC the Riverway/Upstate Revitalization Initiative funds appropriated to the Project in Section 1 herein and \$100,000 from a portion of the proceeds of City bonds authorized and appropriated for the Project in a concurrent ordinance.

Section 4. The agreements authorized herein shall contain such additional terms and conditions as the Mayor deems appropriate.

Section 5. Ordinance No. 2023-5, Bond Ordinance of the City of Rochester, New York authorizing the issuance of \$500,000 Bonds of said City to finance the costs of the Aqueduct Street Group Project, is hereby amended in Section 1 thereof to read as follows:

Section 1. The City of Rochester, in the County of Monroe, New York (herein called "City"), is hereby authorized to finance a portion of the costs of the Aqueduct Street Group Project, including pavement reconstruction, pavement width changes, new curbs and bump-outs, curb ramps, sidewalks, and catch basins on the following street segments: Aqueduct Street (Bank Place to East Main Street), Bank Place (Exchange Boulevard to Aqueduct Street), Basin Street (Exchange Boulevard to Aqueduct Street), Graves Street (Race Street to East Main Street) and Race Street (Aqueduct Street to Graves Street) (the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$2,495,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$500,000 in bonds of the City, which amount is hereby appropriated therefor, \$1,960,000 in reimbursements of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARPA") funds appropriated in Ordinance No. ~~2022-378~~ 2022-377, \$35,000 from 2022-23 Cash Capital, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 6. Ordinance No. 2023-6, Bond Ordinance of the City of Rochester, New York authorizing the issuance of \$50,000 Bonds of said City to finance water main and water service improvements associated with the Aqueduct Street Group, is hereby amended in Section 1 thereof to read as follows:

Section 1. The City of Rochester, in the County of Monroe, New York (herein called "City"), is hereby authorized to finance the cost of water service improvements, including the installation of new hydrants and new water valve boxes, related to the Aqueduct Street Group Project on the following street segments: Aqueduct Street (Bank Place to East Main Street), Bank Place (Exchange Boulevard to Aqueduct Street), Basin Street (Exchange Boulevard to Aqueduct Street), Graves Street (Race Street to East Main Street) and Race Street (Aqueduct Street to Graves Street) (the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$90,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$50,000 bonds of the City, which amount is hereby appropriated therefor, \$40,000 in reimbursements of American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 ("ARPA") funds appropriated in Ordinance No. ~~2022-378~~ 2022-377, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the

principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect immediately.

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Ordinance No. 2024-244

Bond Ordinance of the City of Rochester, New York authorizing the issuance of \$2,125,000 Bonds of said City to finance the Joseph A. Floreano Rochester Riverside Convention Center (RRCC) Building Envelope Repairs and Main Street Addition Project

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. The City of Rochester, in the County of Monroe, New York (herein called "City"), is hereby authorized to finance a portion of the costs of the Joseph A. Floreano Rochester Riverside Convention Center (RRCC) Building Envelope Repairs and Main Street Addition Project improvements to the RRCC, 123 East Main Street, including the construction of a building addition to provide additional event space facing Main Street and capital improvements to the existing facility that include repairs to the exterior building envelope and site upgrades (collectively the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$13,125,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$2,125,000 bonds of the City, which amount is hereby appropriated therefor, \$675,000 in anticipated reimbursements from the ROC the Riverway/Upstate Revitalization Initiative administered by Empire State Development (ROC the Riverway) appropriated in Ordinance No. 2021-53 as amended by Ordinance Nos. 2023-3 and 2023-68, \$6,000,000 in United States Treasury funds provided to the City pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 and appropriated by Ordinance No. 2022-378, \$4,325,000 in additional ROC the Riverway funds appropriated in a concurrent

ordinance and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$2,125,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of New York, including the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), this Ordinance, and other proceedings and determinations related thereto.

Section 3. The City intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the City, pursuant to this Ordinance, in the amount of \$2,125,000. This Ordinance is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

Section 4. The period of probable usefulness of said class of objects or purposes described in Section 1 of this Ordinance, within the limitations of 11.00 a.12(a)(1) of the Law, is twenty-five (25) years.

Section 5. Each of the bonds authorized by this Ordinance and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, shall be general obligations of the City, payable as to both principal and interest by an ad valorem tax upon all the taxable real property within the City without limitation as to rate or amount. The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and of said Law, and pursuant to the provisions of Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes or the renewals thereof, and of Sections 50.00, 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of said Law, the powers and duties of the City Council relative to authorizing the issuance of any notes in anticipation of the sale of the bonds herein authorized, or the renewals thereof, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining debt service, prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds or the renewals of said notes, as well as to executing agreements for credit enhancement, are hereby delegated to the Director of Finance, as the Chief Fiscal Officer of the City.

Section 7. The validity of the bonds authorized by this Ordinance and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the City is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such Ordinance are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity, is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 8. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately, and the City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish a summary of the foregoing Ordinance, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Law in "The Daily Record," a newspaper published in Rochester, New York, having a general circulation in the City and hereby designated the official newspaper of said City for such publication.

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Ordinance No. 2024-245

Bond Ordinance of the City of Rochester, New York authorizing the issuance of \$1,327,000 Bonds of said City to finance the 2024 Annual Parking Garage Repair & Reconstruction Project

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. The City of Rochester, in the County of Monroe, New York (herein called "City"), is hereby authorized to finance the costs of the 2024 Annual Parking Garage Repair & Reconstruction Project for preserving the safety, structural integrity and service life of City parking garages including strategic repairs and reconstruction of concrete decks, concrete beams and columns, supplemental post-tensioning systems, waterproofing and expansion joints in both wings of the South Avenue Garage located at 36-70 South Avenue and stair tower enclosure repairs, concrete deck repairs and waterproofing in the High Falls Garage located at 240 State Street (the "Project"). The estimated maximum cost of said class of objects or purposes, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, is \$4,379,000. The plan of financing includes the issuance of \$1,327,000 bonds of the City, which amount is hereby appropriated for the Project, \$8,715 in 2020-21 Cash Capital, \$263,180.54 in 2022-23 Cash Capital, \$2,780,104.46 in 2023-24 Cash Capital and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the City to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Bonds of the City in the principal amount of \$1,327,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of New York, including the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called the "Law"), this Ordinance, and other proceedings and determinations related thereto.

Section 3. The City intends to finance, on an interim basis, the costs or a portion of the costs of said improvements for which bonds are herein authorized, which costs are reasonably expected to be reimbursed with the proceeds of debt to be incurred by the City, pursuant to this Ordinance, in the amount of \$1,327,000. This Ordinance is a declaration of official intent adopted pursuant to the requirements of Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2.

The faith and credit of the City are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the City by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 6. Authorizing an amendatory agreement with the New York State Department of Transportation to provide snow and ice control services

Authorizing an agreement for Phase III of the City Schools Facilities Modernization Program

WHEREAS, Chapter 416 of the 2007 Laws of New York State enacted an Rochester School Facilities Modernization Program Act (Act), in order to provide the City of Rochester (City) and the Rochester City School District (District) with alternative financing mechanisms for a Rochester School Facilities Modernization Program (FMP) for the reconstruction of up to thirteen school buildings for a maximum cost of \$325 million;

WHEREAS, the Act created the Rochester Joint Schools Construction Board (RJSCB), designated the RJSCB as agent for the City and District and authorized it to enter into a cooperative agreement with the City and the District to carry out the FMP, hereinafter referred to as the Phase I FMP Agreement, which the City authorized in Ordinance No. 2010-8;

WHEREAS, Chapter 533 of the 2014 Laws of New York State amended the FMP Act to authorize a Phase II FMP consisting of up to 26 projects including a District Wide Technology program ("Phase II FMP Projects) for a maximum cost of \$435 million, and the parties executed another cooperative agreement to carry out the Phase II FMP Projects, which was authorized in City Ordinance No. 2015-121 and amended in accordance with Ordinance No. 2016-225;

WHEREAS, Chapter 614 of the 2021 Laws of New York State further amended the Act to authorize a Phase III FMP consisting of up to 12 projects ("Phase III FMP Projects"), for a maximum cost of \$475 million; and

WHEREAS, the parties have prepared and the RJSCB and the District have signed a Phase III Cooperative Agreement that provides for the financing, planning and construction of Phase III FMP Projects in accordance with the Act as amended.
