The HOPWA HRS and Peer assured that every client has 2 home visits, 1 case conferences and all documentation is completed annually. The HOPWA Program continues to collaborate with Catholic Charities Family & Community Services (CCFCS's) AIDS Institute Housing grants. For example: HOPWA would assist with security deposits and AIDS Institute would assist with the first month's rent and household items. CCFCS has administered the HOPWA Program since 1994.
