
Open House Format

- 3. Open ended questions








1. Mapping - Challenges

Key Takeaways:

- Improved parking to support increased business
- School zone needs traffic calming
- Bike / pedestrian improvements Ave D
- Loitering / illicit activity corner of Wilkins St.
- Unhoused persons / illegal drug use JAACA property
- Community Gardens need support
- Clear understory/improve visibility Shared yard south of Dale St.
- Not enough seating along corridor



1. Mapping – Opportunities for Public Art

Key Takeaways:

- Public art in school zone to calm traffic
- Continuous intervention along corridor
- Lincoln Branch Library
- M.U.S.E. lots
- Poetry Artwalk
- Art as infrastructure (site furniture and amenities)
- B'nai Israel / JAACA site



2. Prompting questions + images

Key Takeaways:

Art

- Interactive installations + street/sidewalk art most desired
- Followed by murals, performance space + community gardens
- Artistic street furniture/amenities

Streetscape


- Lighting, sidewalks, bike amenities + street trees most desired
- Followed by improved crosswalks, increased benches, improved bike infrastructure, and bus seating/shelters

Outcomes

- Improved safety, collaboration between City, service providers, and community - most desired
- Followed by beautification + neighborhood pride

Money is not an issue!


- Community Center w/ outdoor playground + programs

Vacant Lots


- Youth programming / violence intervention



Transportation

Pedestrian – Needs

- Improved curb ramps and ADA accessibility
- Improved sidewalk quality
- Improved crosswalks countdown timers
- Midblock crossings
- More seating

Bike – Needs

- Dedicated bike lane where feasible
- Improved / increased bike amenities

Vehicular

- Traffic calming at key intersections
- Accommodation of multi-modal traffic

Transit

- Improved and increased bus shelters
- Adequate lighting and appropriate siting for safety





Safety (Actual + Perceived)

Streetscape

- Establish consistent setback
- Improved and increased litter collection and storage
- Selective removal and clearing of underbrush in key locations (shared yard between Dale St. + Seabrook St.)

Drug related Activity

- Public realm improvements and residential/commercial infill of vacant lots and store fronts
- Siting sharps boxes
- Needle sweeps in public space





Public Realm

Street Trees

 Consistent tree lawn + spacing – appropriately selected species + establishment protections

Building Facades


- Fortified / protected facades safety concerns lead to increased perceived danger
- Need more transparency at street level CPTED eyes on the street

Site furniture / Amenities

- Need increased (accessible) seating
- Increased site amenities bike racks, trash receptacles

Signage

- Need improved signage for business
- Neighborhood identity + history





Art

Needs

- Cohesive aesthetic throughout corridor
- Daylight arts / cultural activity

Opportunities

- Wall therapy program building off existing public art
- Active arts and cultural institutions
- Rich history to be interpreted through public art + placemaking
- Vacant lots blank canvas
- Art as infrastructure





Vacant Lots

Needs

- Decrease/eliminate perception of urban blight
- Safety concerns paraphernalia + associated activities
- Sustainable maintenance plan

Opportunities

- Green infrastructure
- Flexible program space community, services, arts, recreation, therapy
- Try-it locations
- Residential + commercial infill





Safety

- Focus on problematic intersections/hangouts
- Improved lighting
- Improved line of sight

Transportation


- Traffic calming at key intersections
- Dedicated bike lane connection to Norton
- Artistic crosswalks, midblock crossings, Bike + Ped Amenities
- Possible future bus Shelter at Clifford

Public Realm

- Street trees throughout
- Artistic site furniture + amenities
- Programming key vacant lots
- School zone improvements

Arts / Culture

- Arts + Culture epicenter connecting neighborhood centers/local business
- Art as infrastructure
