Re: Community Cannabis Support Initiative – Appropriation and Professional Services Agreement

Council Priority: Creating and Sustaining a Culture of Vibrancy

Comprehensive Plan 2034 Initiative Area: Reinforcing Strong Neighborhoods, Fostering Prosperity and Opportunity

Transmitted herewith for your approval is legislation relating to a Community Cannabis Support Initiative to provide services to Rochester residents seeking to be a part of the emerging "legal" cannabis industry under an agreement with BLOOM ROC.

This local organization provides unique strategic solutions to invest and pool resources, talents, and expertise in the emerging cannabis industry. BLOOM ROC's overarching aim is to create and protect sustainable economic development in marginalized communities by fostering tangible and lasting enhancements in the early stages of cannabis businesses using a model they call S.E.E. (Social and Economic Equity).

This legislation will:

- Amend the 2024-25 Budget of the Office of the Mayor by appropriating \$50,000 in fund balance that this Council previously committed to Emerging Community Initiatives in Resolution No. 2024-28.
- Authorize a professional services agreement with BLOOM ROC to provide direct educational and other support services to Rochester residents seeking to be a part of the emerging "legal" cannabis industry and BLOOM ROC shall provide thereafter a report to the City that summarizes their progress, including the number of residents served. The maximum compensation for the agreement will be \$50,000, funded by the 2024-25 Budget of the Office of the Mayor from the funds authorized above.

BLOOM ROC has a well-established curriculum to support those seeking to be a part of the emerging "legal" cannabis industry and the city's funding will support city residents' access to and continuation of BLOOM ROC's Incubator Program; Town Halls; and other educational programs and community outreach.

Prior Bloom ROC programming included:

- 8 Week Incubator Program Focused on Adult-Use Application Preparation and Support using a hybrid model (In-Person/Virtual); Individualized Education; One on One's; using a Community Hub Model; Professional Development and Support from Ancillary Partners; Networking with clients/customers and like-minded individuals in the Canna-Community.
 - Supported 140 potential S.E.E. applicants with small group and 1-on-1 technical assistance programming.
 - Submitted 25 applications representing the Finger Lakes and the Western regions over four licensing types.
 - 7 Applicants engaged throughout the Technical Assistance Provider program.
 - 5 Non-provisional applicants, two provisional applicants.
 - 5 Non-Provisional Application deficiencies were cured.
- Town Halls Community gatherings held to keep stakeholders informed and updated on BLOOM ROC's cannabis education.
 - ➤ Hosted 6 Town-halls designed to inform residents of industry updates locally, regionally, and throughout the state.
- Education focused on cannabis and Public Health; Public Health Data and Trends; all focused on the impact of cannabis legalization on public health and strategies for promoting responsible use and reducing potential harms.
 - > 3 monthly educational learning experiences held.
 - Includes participation in government and civic engagement focused on the Finger Lakes Region of New York.
 - Overview of the Cannabis Advisory Board and funding expectations focused on the Cannabis Advisory Board and other funding expectations from New York State.
- Community Outreach
 - Spent 275 hours directly engaging Rochester's disproportionately impacted East/West/North-side communities, touching over 67 streets, 5 regional dispensaries, and 7 NY licensees.
 - Engaged over 564 residents in the region.
 - Engaged community giveback that supported 25 vulnerable families with essential items.
 - Tabled at the Science of Cannabis Symposium in Rochester, New York.
 - Exhibited at the Cannabis World Business Expo in New York.

The term for the Community Cannabis Support Initiative shall extend to December 31, 2025, and the deadline for providing all reporting shall be June 30, 2026.

Awarding a Professional Services Agreement Without a Request for Proposals

How was the vendor selected?

BLOOM ROC provides unique strategic solutions to invest and pool resources, talents, and expertise in the emerging cannabis industry. No other not-for-profit organization is providing the services in this area that BLOOM ROC does.

Why was no RFP issued for this service?

 Is there previous experience with the vendor? The City Council has had a positive relationship and history with BLOOM ROC since its inception and this organization has been an invaluable resource to the City as it has navigated the new territory of "legal" cannabis regulation.

Compensation Amount: \$50,000

How was this determined? Explain how it is a reasonable and best value for the City.

The agreement will provide \$50,000 for BLOOM ROC to provide direct educational and other support services to Rochester residents seeking to be a part of the emerging "legal" cannabis industry and BLOOM ROC shall provide thereafter a report to the City that summarizes their progress, including the number of residents served. BLOOM ROC has a well-established curriculum to support those seeking to be a part of the emerging "legal" cannabis industry and the city's funding will support city residents' access to and continuation of BLOOM ROC's Incubator Program; Town Halls; and other educational programs and community outreach. These services would include: Adult-Use Application Preparation and Support; Professional Development and Support; hosting Town Hall-style meetings; engaging Rochester's disproportionately impacted communities/neighborhoods; and additional community outreach/education/support.

Appropriating funds, amending the 2024-25 Budget and authorizing an agreement for the Community Cannabis Support Initiative

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the City of Rochester as follows:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 2024-200, the 2024-25 Budget of the City of Rochester, as amended, is hereby further amended by increasing the revenue estimates and appropriations to the Budget of the Office of the Mayor by \$50,000, which amount is hereby appropriated from a portion of the remaining Fund Balance of the 2023-24 Budget of City Council & Clerk that Council committed to emerging community needs in Resolution No. 2024-28.

Section 2. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into a professional services agreement with BLOOM ROC Inc. to provide direct educational and other support services to Rochester residents seeking to be a part of the emerging legal cannabis industry as part of a Community Cannabis Support Initiative. The term for these services shall extend to December 31, 2025, and the deadline for providing all reporting shall be June 30, 2026. The maximum compensation for the agreement shall be \$50,000, which shall be funded from the 2024-25 Budget of the Office of the Mayor.

Section 3. The agreement shall contain such additional terms and conditions as the Mayor deems appropriate.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
