Resolved: That Orlando Hastings charge for cancelling be allowed at five dollars.

Resolved: That Moses Chapin's account for Justices fees be allowed at three dollars and forty eight cents.

Resolved: That Hoyt, Porter & C's account for printing and advertising be allowed at forty one dollars and twenty five cents.

Resolved: That Charles H. Carroll's claim for rent of a portion of H. Carroll's Market not included in his lease to the Trustees be allowed at twelve dollars and thirty five cents; provided he and his wife accept such sum in full discharge of such claim.

Resolved: That the account of Ropiter & Hoyt for sundries paid M.C. Terry during the season of 1831 per order of the President of the Village be allowed at eight dollars and thirty four cents, and that they have an order therefor.

The said Bonsteel and Schleicher to have the use of the residue of the north part of the market as a store room until it shall be otherwise rented.
